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ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Without William Shakespeare, I would not be where I am today. He launched my career... twice! My very first acting role was playing Puck at age 13 in A Midsummer Night's Dream (at the Chicago Renaissance Faire) and my first directing assignment was The Taming of the Shrew (at a storefront theatre in LA). In addition, I have performed the role of Feste in Twelfth Night (in high school - photo lower right), lago (my Chicago professional acting debut - photo lower left) and The Fool in different productions of Othello, and Puck once more. I have also directed Kiss Me Kate at a theatre in upstate New York (in an active train station - we had to pause the show whenever a train went by), Love's Labour's Lost, Love's Fire (based on Shakespearean sonnets), adapted, and directed a rock and roll version of A Midsummer Night's Dream, and seen much of the rest of Shakespeare's canon at Stratford Festivals in Canada and England, and many theatres in between.

Shakespeare is the pinnacle of authorship. He is also the pinnacle of inspiration from Kiss Me Kate to West Side Story, and even films like The Lion King (Hamlet), Anyone But You (Much Ado About Nothing), My Own Private Idaho (Henry IV and V), and (according to Wikipedia) 99 films based on Romeo and Juliet. Shakespeare's plays are malleable and can be seen set in unexpected and modern locations: As You Like It in a karaoke bar, Romeo and Juliet with cowboys in New Mexico, King Lear at the Woodstock music festival.

What I love so much about the musical *Juliet and Romeo* is that there is a perfect (and hilarious) balance of Shakespeare folks, familiar to many of us, and new folks, trying to navigate the modern world, belief in oneself, and permission to love. It therefore comes by both its Shakespearean and non-Shakespearean moments authentically. The backdrop is definitively Shakespeare, but the modern foreground is where the heart and message reside. The two worlds colliding creates a delightful cocktail that bubbles and fizzes with joy and song.

This production is a world premiere, of which we at Skylight are extremely proud. No matter where *Juliet and Romeo* journeys next, it will have been born here at Skylight. The imprint of our artists on both sides of the proscenium, our small but mighty staff, and you, its first audiences, will forever be part of its DNA.

Passions run high in this musical, as do the personal stakes. That makes for good plays but can also make for a well-lived and loved life. Perhaps we can take some tips from Shakespeare with regard to diving into life with gusto, and from Sawyer Bloom, whom you are about to meet, with regard to happy endings.




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

Michael Unger (Director/Artistic Director) For Skylight, Michael has directed Dennis DeYoung's The Hunchback of Notre Dame (nine BroadwayWorld Awards - including Best Director and Best Musical), the Deaf and Hearing production of Spring Awakening, Oliver!, School of Rock, Noises Off, Little Shop of Horrors, A Jolly Holiday: Celebrating Disney's Broadway Hits, as well as Me, Myself and I for Skylight's Education program. Amongst many virtual offerings, he directed Skylight's BroadwayWorld Award-winning Being Earnest, now available worldwide online. He was previously the Associate Artistic Director of Off-Broadway's York Theatre; credits there included You're A Good Man Charlie Brown and Big. For nine years, he was the Producina Artistic Director of NewArts, started with a local father in response to the Sandy Hook Elementary School tragedy; directing 17 productions working with over 650 area-children. Other selected directing credits include A Christmas Carol (McCarter Theatre for 18 years), Two Point Oh (NY Times Critics' Pick), Time Stands Still (Cape Cod Chronicle Best 2015), My Sister in This House (Deaf West, Ovation Recommended), and new versions of Kander and Ebb's The Happy Time and The Rink. Knight's Tale, written with John Caird, has had multiple productions in Japan. Sax and Eric Rosen, as well as the score for Barry Edelstein's *Timon*

of Athens. With Thomas Mizer, he was awarded the Fred Ebb and Jonathan Larson awards. His musical *Triangle* was commissioned by Williamstown Theatre Festival and went on to win six Theatre Bay Area Awards and two SF Bay Area Critics Circle Áwards including Best Musical for the TheatreWorks Silicon Valley production. He teamed up with Amanda Green, Mizer. and Matthew Brookshire on the Fringe Festival hit, For The Love Of Tiffany, and is currently working on new musicals Regency Girls and The Amazing Mr. X. He composed the score for the Fox animated show HouseBroken staring Lisa Kudrow. He conducted and performed the music in The Bridge Project's critically acclaimed world tour of Richard III directed by Sam Mendes, and wrote and performed the music for Todd Solondz' film Palindromes. Susan Varela (Executive Director) Originally from Milwaukee and a graduate of UW-Stevens Point, her professional career as a performer landed her in New York City for 20 years. She performed on Broadway in Les Misérables and at Radio City Music Hall in The Music of Andrew Lloyd Webber. Other notable performances include Jo March in Little Women: The Musical; Grizabella in Cats and Eva Peron in Evita. Susan performed in world premieres at both the Denver Center Theater (for their Tony-award winning season) and the Yale Repertory Theater. Before joining the Skylight staff, she appeared on the Cabot stage in Sweeney Todd, Into the Woods, The Wizard of Oz, and Les Misérables. Susan has produced, directed, performed and written for the stage and television alongside her husband, actor Andrew Varela. Susan currently serves on the board of directors for Brew City Opera and The Historic Third Ward Association.

William Shakespeare (Playwright of Romeo and Juliet) Thee Bard himself, born April 23, 1564, in Stratford-upon-Avon, United Kingdom (died April 23, 1616), is the most famous writer ever. This is according to many scholars, theatre aficionados, and, yes, Shakespeare, himself. In his exactly 52 years, the Bard wrote around 37 plays and over 150 poems that are still thrilling and confounding scholars today, as well as inspiring and annoying many directors. Some say he was a secret agent, others a ghostwriter. One thing you can say about the man, he knew how to turn a phrase. When it comes to Shakespeare, one could say, "Some are born great, some achieve greatness, and some have greatness thrust upon them." In Shakespeare's case, it was all of the above.

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
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
